SPARKING CREATIVITY WITH HOPE

At a time when the light of the world was diminished, Asha worked with producers from Kashmir to spark their creativity by providing them with molds & other raw materials for making papier-mâché products. Our designers worked with producers to provide them with new product ideas with designs for new product development.





Our design & quality team also worked with a producer at Saharanpur, where they developed 6 brand new wooden games. Orders for this newly developed game have provided much needed work for these artisans, helping them look after their families in a better way.

The team also worked to assist one of our textile producers at Agra to set up a new workshop to provide artisans with a safe working environment.

For the safety of our artisans, our Medical Center at Saharanpur was temporarily closed during the COVID-19 lockdown. However, we are pleased to have re-opened this free medical service from February 2021.



Asha's evergrowing concern for the environment prompted us to plant 70 Mango tree saplings. These will not only look after the environment, but provide sustainable wood for handicrafts.
